CDL Fund – Forever Manchester

The CDL Fund is open to organisations based and delivering activity in any of the ten boroughs of Greater Manchester.

The Fund aims to support the activities of local community or voluntary groups and projects that contribute positively to the quality of life, wellbeing and improved health of people and communities which address any or all of the priorities listed below:

- Older people
- Children and young people
- Stronger communities
- Environment
- Health and Wellbeing

The CDL Fund is particularly keen to receive applications from groups who are using technology to adapt their activities or change how they support their community during the Covid-19 pandemic and just need a little bit of funding to make this happen.

The Charity Service

The Grant Fund is provided and administered by the Charity Service, a registered charity supporting VCSE sector organisations in Greater Manchester. The funding is intended for local organisations working with people who are disadvantaged, sick, infirm, or living in poverty in the area.

Registered charities, community interest companies (CICs) and voluntary organisations can apply. Multiple applications from one organisation will be considered although these must not be for the same purpose.

Funding is at the discretion of The Charity Service

Grants can be used for:

- The purchase or supply of activities, amenities or items of a medical nature NOT supplied by the NHS.

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- The purchase or supply of activities, amenities or equipment that will improve the general welfare of the local community or an individual.
- New project costs (for a specific time).
- Any other charitable purpose that has a direct impact on the welfare of the local community or an individual.

Duchy of Lancaster Benevolent Fund

The Greater Manchester Trustees are particularly interested in the following:

- Causes with which the Duchy has historical association such as Church livings, Estates etc. within the boundaries of the three Counties (Greater Manchester, Lancashire, and Merseyside) and purposes which will benefit the community
- Trusts, Associations, and Institutions that maintain and preserve monuments, Estates and possessions of the Duchy which prove to be of benefit to the public and local community
- Organisations which provide care and support for the elderly, inform and disadvantaged members of society

GM Emergency Grants for GM BAME Communities

Grants of £50-£1000 to fund small BAME led VCSE organisations to respond to the needs of their communities during the COVID-19 pandemic. Activities must be expected to end by 30th June 2021.

What they can fund

- Services and activities that support the health and wellbeing of members of vulnerable BAME communities in Greater Manchester

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- Foodbanks and projects working to combat hardship caused by the pandemic
- Organisations or informal groups that have been specifically established to respond to the crisis
- Volunteer costs for new and existing organisations responding to the effect of the crisis
- Additional costs of working remotely and adapting services delivered in the wider community
- Support for organisations that provide support for vulnerable groups within BAME communities to counter the loss of income and fundraising which can be directly linked to the COVID-19 pandemic

- give
- and learn.

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GM Moving Walking Grants

Funded by Greater Manchester Moving (with money from Greater Manchester Health and Social Care Partnership), **grants up to £3,000** are being offered to support activities that encourage people who are usually less active to start or increase the amount they walk regularly whilst adhering to government social distancing restrictions.

Applications also need to address one or more of the following:

- Support individuals not in work, with long term health conditions or young people;
- Engage with communities, schools and businesses to encourage walking as part of the daily routine;
- Work with communities to understand key walking destinations, routes and local barriers and solutions to get people walking;
- Increase the number of trained and confident “Walking Champions” who are active in the community;
- Make environmental changes/improvements that will encourage walking.

GMCVO - Emergency Investment Fund

Emergency Investment Fund application deadline extended until 26th February 2021. Open now for applications by organisations impacted by Covid-19

GMCVO launched our Emergency Investment Fund in September with the application window due to end in December. However, as a Charity and Social Enterprise ourselves we understand that the financial challenges haven't gone away, and are likely to increase in the new year. Therefore we have extended the application window until 26th February 2021.

The **fund provides loans of £50-250k** and still provides great flexibility with an initial interest and repayment holiday period of up to 2 years, and then 3 years to repay.

It's **targeted at Social Enterprises, Charities and Community Businesses** who have been negatively impacted by the Covid-19 crisis and haven't been able to access sufficient working capital for their needs over the covid-19 crisis. Applicants need to have been a viable business before the crisis and we need to understand why they've been unable to access sufficient Government support e.g. Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme, Bounce Back Loans etc. or why that support isn't appropriate to their needs.

In addition to our Emergency Investment fund, GMCVO have partnered with the Social Investment Business to support organisations to apply for their [Resilience and Recovery fund](#). This fund can provide loans of up to £1.5 million for larger organisations.

Tesco Bags of Help - £1K Children & Young People Grants

During October, November and December, Tesco Bags of Help's grant scheme will be providing grants of up to £1000 to support projects focused on local children and young people. This is in place of in store voting, which we have had to pause due to the ongoing crisis.

Examples of projects which could be funded include:

- Mental Health support for children and young people – COVID-19 has had an impact on the health and well being of children, particularly mental health.
- Outdoor activities – sport & green space provision for children & young people including use of green spaces support well being through physical activities.

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- Non statutory educational activities – to support, widen and rebuild educational support networks for children, web-based activities. Sport, exercise, and arts.
- Young carers– support for young carers as a result of current and continued isolation.
- Bereavement counselling – offering support to children that have lost family members and support networks due to COVID-19
- Child poverty – to support organisations that offer family support that are further impacted by COVID-19, which could include food/educational packs, free activities.
- Vulnerable at-risk children – the pandemic has impacted vulnerable children with challenging home & family circumstances.

Who is eligible?

- Grants will be awarded to voluntary or community organisations (including registered charities/companies), schools, health bodies (e.g. Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs), NHS Hospital Trust, Foundation Trust), Parish/Town Councils, local authorities and social housing providers.

Trafford Community Challenge – GM Moving Funding

GM Moving: Local Pilot Community Ideas and Proposals - Challenge Summary
Working together, with partners to develop sustainable opportunities for people to engage in regular physical activity. The focus area is predominately Partington, however due to Covid-19 this is open to Trafford wide groups who meet the criteria for the funding:

Work with or can develop opportunities to support our 3 core groups

- 5-18 Yrs. outside of the curriculum
- 40-60 Yrs. with long-term conditions*
- The unemployed or those at risk of becoming unemployed

* Specifically, cancer, cardiovascular disease, and respiratory disorders

Your group will need to work together to.

- Develop a proposal
- Detail the costs
- Explain who is involved and how
- Identify who is going to lead the project

The proposal must clearly demonstrate how it will engage one of the three core groups with long-term conditions in sustainable activity.

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Proposals should work on a budget that does not exceed £5,000.

Criteria for applying.

- Constituted Group or Groups (Charity/ Trust/CIC/CIO/Community Sports Club or Community Group)
- Based in Trafford and support Trafford residents
- Proposals from Partington based groups are preferable however open to Trafford wide groups meeting the criteria due to Covid-19

- 5-18 Yrs. outside of the curriculum
- 40-60 Yrs. with long-term conditions
- The unemployed or those at risk of becoming unemployed

Trafford Housing Trust – Social Investment Funding

You can apply online for a Micro, Small, Medium, or Large grant. For Large grants there is a two-stage application process.

To be eligible for the fund...

1. Your work must meet one (or more) of our anti-poverty priorities:

- Strengthens families and communities
- Increases household incomes and reduces living costs
- Enhances prospects for life through improved education and skills
- Builds the local economy to benefit everyone

2. Your work must benefit people in Trafford (and may also involve people in surrounding areas).

These are the essential criteria for any level of funding, from £500 to £100,000.

The type of organisation you are, will affect how much you are eligible to apply for.

For example, if you are an individual, you will only be eligible for a Micro Grant of up to £500.

Barrow Cadbury Trust – The Connect Fund

Following Covid-19 the trust has re-focused the Connect Fund's priorities across three main areas to support work that will best prepare the infrastructure of the social investment market to respond to the needs of charities and social enterprises in a challenging recovery phase.

The focus areas are:

- **Equality and diversity** - to support work that addresses diversity and inclusion in the social investment sector as well as issues of inequality in the social investment market.
- **Business support development** - to support projects that prepare infrastructure organisations to provide appropriate business support into the recovery phase and further our understanding about what the sector needs to adapt and be resilient to future shocks.

Organisations applying must be:

The organisation must be incorporated and registered as a charity, social enterprise or have social purpose clearly incorporated into the articles of association.

Applications from BAME-led, Disability-led, LGBTQ+-led, and Women-led infrastructure and intermediary organisations are particularly welcomed.

BBC Children in Need Grants

Small Grants 2020 – Up to £10,000 per year and Main Grants 2020 - Over £10,000 per year

Grants can be used to support children and young people aged 18 years and under experiencing disadvantage through:

- Illness, distress, abuse, or neglect.
- Any kind of disability.
- Behavioural or psychological difficulties.
- Living in poverty or situations of deprivation.

The work they fund make differences in children's lives that help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face. Funded organisations achieve these differences by either working directly with children or seeking to improve their social and physical environments.

The deadline for both programmes is 11.30am 21st December 2020.

BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme

The BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme which supports children and young people up to the age of 18 living with severe poverty as well as additional pressures such as domestic violence, disability or poor health in the family is currently open for applications from referral organisations that will be able to apply for grants on behalf of families or young people.

Applications must be completed by a registered referrer who are part of an organisation that is supporting the family or young person and capable of assessing their needs. The referrer's organisation should also be able to administer and supervise the grant on our behalf. Organisations can apply to become a referral organisation to help assess and administer the emergency essentials funding.

The funding can deliver or fund critical items such as:

- Electric cookers
- Furniture
- Kitchen equipment and small appliances
- Children's beds and bedding (including cots)
- Washing machines and tumble dryers
- Fridges, freezers, and fridge-freezers
- Baby equipment
- Clothing

British Red Cross – Hardship Funding for Individuals

The Hardship Fund was created by the British Red Cross with partner Aviva to help those most financially impacted by the coronavirus outbreak.

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Official Referral Partners register people with us for support.

The fund then provides short term financial help for people who cannot afford the essentials:

- Food and toiletries
- Somewhere safe to sleep
- Access to a telephone and the internet
- Fuel to keep the lights on, cook or stay warm

Our network of Referral Partner organisations registers people for cash assistance. They can request a one-off payment of £120 or a three-month grant.

People registered for the three-month grant will receive £360, paid in monthly instalments of £120 each.

Families with children or other dependants can receive up to three grants, for a total of £1,080 over the three months.

Comic Relief Capacity Building Grants ***Currently Paused Due to Open Application Soon***

Charities, voluntary and community organisations, social enterprises and CIC's in England which have been negatively impacted by Covid-19 can apply for grants of **up to £1,000** to help them rebuild their capacity to meet the needs of their local community.

The funding is being made available through the Comic Relief's Capacity Building Grants Scheme and will support projects within their four strategic themes and can be used for a wide range of activities, such as:

- training.
- increasing delivery capacity through additional volunteer recruitment.
- and developing strategies to help rebuild and move forward such as fundraising strategies and developing new delivery plans.

To be eligible, applicants will need to have an annual income of less than £250,000.

Clothworkers' Open Grants Programme

The Clothworkers' Open Grants programme will award grants to UK registered charities, CICs, and other registered UK not-for-profit organisations (including special schools). Grants are awarded towards capital projects which are defined as:

- **Buildings:** purchase, construction, renovation, or refurbishment.
- **Fittings, Fixtures, and Equipment:** this includes but is not limited to office equipment/furniture, sports/gym equipment, digital/audio visual equipment, garden equipment, specialist therapeutic (excluding medical) equipment. It does not include equipment for one-off use, or which will be given to service users for personal use on a permanent basis.
- **Vehicles:** This includes a minibus, car, caravan, people-carrier, or 4X4. We are unlikely to fund the total cost of a new vehicle.

The programme wants to fund organisations that support people in the following areas:

- Alcohol and substance misuse
- Disadvantaged minority groups
- Disadvantaged young people
- Domestic & sexual abuse
- Homelessness
- Older People
- People with disabilities
- Prisoners and ex-offenders
- Visual impairment

A decision will be made within eight weeks for grants and projects less than £10,000 or within six months for grants over £10,000.

The Resilience and Recovery Loan Fund (RRLF)

The Resilience and Recovery Loan Fund (RRLF) is a new emergency loan fund which will provide repayable finance to charities and social enterprises who are experiencing disruption as a result of COVID-19 and is intended for such organisations who have an otherwise viable business model. It has been established to make the Government's existing Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS) more easily accessible to these entities.

Is my organisation eligible?

This Fund is only for UK charities and social enterprises which fulfil the eligibility criteria of both the Fund and CBILS – the full list of eligibility criteria can be found on the SIB website and includes:

- registered charities, community interest companies, community benefit societies – in line with Big Society Capital [governance principles](#).
- have a minimum turnover of £400k.
- have been trading for a minimum of two years.

CBILS eligibility that applies to the fund includes that organisations must:

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- be UK-based.
- have a turnover of less than £45m (whole group).
- have a minimum 50% of income from trading (registered charities and further education colleges are exempt from this requirement).
- self-certify they have been adversely affected by COVID-19.

What are the RRLF's key product details?

Key features of the product include:

- initially loans will be for between £100k and £500k.
- these loans will be interest-free and fee-free to the customer for the first 12 months (in line with CBILS).
- the loan term will be a minimum of 1 year and a maximum of 3 years.
- interest will be charged at 6.5% per annum for years 2 and 3 (after principal payments start).

Applicants should also be aware that any monies received under the CBILS does not reduce the borrower's liability in any way – as with any loan product, the borrower remains 100% liable.

Applicants should also be aware that changes may be made to RRLF as the CBILS scheme evolves. It may take some time for these changes to filter through to the SIB website.

How can I apply and how long will it take?

There is an [application portal on the SIB website](#) which is now live. The first page of the application is intended to give clear guidance on your likely eligibility. The aim is for the process to take 2-4 weeks from start to finish.
