Caged football Volunteer

Overview

Caged Football is one of our more fun activities; volunteers who run this get the chance to engage with members of the public, give key safety messages and at the same time having a kick about.

Caged Football is a portable community facility. It's designed to be used as an activity to divert children and young people away from becoming involved in anti-social behaviour and fire related crime.

If you'd like to make a positive difference in the community, Caged Football is the perfect opportunity to create an open, inclusive environment for young people whilst developing your skills, knowledge and qualifications!

Key responsibilities

To deliver Caged Football activities in locations across Greater Manchester as directed by Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue Service

To deliver Caged Football activities appropriate to the age and ability of the participants.

To plan and organise sessions according to Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue Service guidelines

To carry out dynamic risk assessments and report any incidents / accidents to Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue Service immediately.

To ensure that all GMFRS equipment is in good working order and assembled properly – to report to GMFRS any equipment that needs attention.

To ensure that GMFRS's Codes of Conduct are adhered to.

To assist in the cross promotion of GMFRS activities.

To attend training courses continuing professional development as required.

To adhere to National Governing Body (FA) guidelines.

This role is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) Order 1975 (as amended in 2013) by S12013 1198 and is subject to an Enhanced disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service.

Applicants are required to disclose any convictions, cautions, reprimands or final warnings that are not "protected" as defined by the Act
